#### CONFERENCE DEDICATION ACURIL LII Jamaica 2023 Dedicates this event to:

Professor (Emerita) Daphne Rowena Douglas, CD

\*\*ACURIL PAST PRESIDENT 1984-1985\*\*



Present at the inaugural meeting of the Jamaica Library Association (JLA), almost seventy-five (75) years ago, Professor Daphne Douglas has spent a lifetime in libraries. Even after she retired, she continued her library work by serving as the chair of the Board of the National Library of Jamaica until well into her 80's.

It is through her role as a library educator that she has made her greatest impact on the profession in Jamaica and in the Caribbean. She is well known for her enthusiasm and love for teaching. One of the first two West Indian lecturers in the Department of Library & Information Studies at The University of the West Indies, she worked in the Department for over 20 years, serving as the head for most of the period. She achieved a 'first' in 1984 when she was appointed Professor of Library Studies, thus becoming the first Jamaican woman to be appointed a professor at the University

She is a past president of both the Library & Information Association of Jamaica as well as ACURIL. She was president of ACURIL 1984-1985 when the 16<sup>th</sup> annual conference was held in San Juan, Puerto Rico from May 12 to 17, 1985.

Among her many awards are Commander of the Order of Distinction, by the Government of Jamaica and the Silver Musgrave Medal of the Institute of Jamaica. The Department of Library & Information Studies established the annual Daphne Douglas Distinguished Lecture in her echonour and the National Library of Jamaica named its main reading room after her.





#### Mrs. Albertina Jefferson

#### \*\*ACURIL PAST PRESIDENT 1987-1988\*\*



Mrs. Albertina Jefferson, better known as Minkey Jefferson, is unique among our honourees in that her library work in Jamaica has been confined to one institution - The University of the West Indies. She served the Library in several capacities, including that of Campus Librarian at Mona and finally as the University Librarian.

She has given distinguished service to the Library and Information Association of Jamaica (LIAJA), of which she is now an Honorary Member, serving as Honorary Secretary and then as President on two separate occasions. Not to be forgotten is the role she played in the planning of the International Library Conference organized by the then Library Association of Jamaica in 1971 and her work as co-editor of the published conference papers. She continues to be active in the library field, as a member and former chair of the Retired Members Group of the Association.

Her service to the library and information profession transcends national boundaries as she has served in many capacities in the International Federation of Library Association (IFLA) and in the Association Caribbean University Research and Institutional Libraries (ACURIL), of which she is a former President (1987-1988).



#### **Stephney Lorraine Ferguson, OD**

#### \*\*ACURIL PAST PRESIDENT 1999-2000\*\*



Miss Stephney Ferguson is a true trailblazer. She is the only Jamaican librarian to have served as the head of four (4) major library institutions in a career which has spanned over four decades. After working at the Jamaica Library Service, she served as the Librarian at the College of Arts, Science and Technology (now University of Technology, Jamaica); Director of the National Library of Jamaica; Senior Lecturer and Head of the Department of Library and Information Studies, The University of the West Indies; the Librarian of the Mona Campus of the University, and finally, the University Librarian. In all these positions she served with distinction.

As the first person to be permanently appointed Director of the National Library, she played a leading role in promoting the Library at home and abroad. Active in regional and international library organizations, Stephney Ferguson served as President of both the Commonwealth Library Association (COMLA) and the Association of Caribbean Universities Research and Institutional Libraries (ACURIL). She was president in 1999-2000 when the 30<sup>th</sup> annual conference was held in the Bahamas, 2000. ACURIL has actually named an award in her honour, *The Stephney Ferguson Library Programs for Special Information Needs*. She was the only Jamaican librarian to have run – unsuccessfully – for the presidency of the International Federation of Library Associations (IFLA). A past president of LIAJA and now an Honorary Member, she was honoured by the Government of Jamaica with the award of Order of Distinction (OD), Officer class.



#### **Professor Claudette Fay Durrant**



After qualifying as a librarian, Professor Claudette Fay Durrant began her career at The University of the West Indies Library, Mona (1968-1973) as an assistant librarian, before moving to UWI Library at Cave Hill (1973–1975) in a similar capacity. She then worked as assistant librarian at the Caribbean Community Secretariat in Guyana (1975–1979) before being appointed library and information training officer at the United Nations Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean in Trinidad (1979–1983). After a stint as an independent consultant, she joined the staff of the International Development Research Centre of Canada as senior programme specialist, with postings in Latin America (1987–1997).

Between 1997 and 2000, she worked at the secretariat of the Association of Caribbean States in Trinidad & Tobago, where she was the director responsible for coordinating the work of the special committees on science, technology, health, education and culture; and the special committee on budget and administration.

She returned to Jamaica in 2000, and Professor Durrant then immersed herself into the library and information sector. She served at various times as a member of the boards of institutions such as the Jamaica Library Service, the National Library of Jamaica, the information committee of the Jamaica National Commission for UNESCO, and on the executive committee of the Library and Information Association of Jamaica (LIAJA). Between 2005 and 2006, she served as president of LIAJA. In 2006, she was elected to serve a two-year term as vice-president of the Intergovernmental Council for UNESCO's "Information for All Programme", the objective of which is to narrow the gap between the information rich and poor and to build an information society.

She was therefore well qualified to serve as professor and head of the Department of Library and Information Studies at the University of the West Indies (UWI) Mona campus, which she did for twelve years. After her retirement, she continued to teach on a part-time basis.

She served on several international, regional and local library related committees and boards, one of them being the ACURIL Executive Council. When the ACURIL Conference was held in Ocho Rios, Jamaica in 2002, she served as the chair of the Local Organizing Committee.

She taught and mentored countless number of students who now hold leadership positions in libraries and information institutions around the Caribbean region. Her former students spoke feelingly about her wise counsel and the care, patience and understanding she showed towards them, especially when the going seemed rough.



Through her many publications and research interests, she made a notable contribution to scholarship and practical implementation of modern communication/technology practices.

Professor Durrant, who was one of Jamaica's most beloved librarians, died on January 8, 2021. Her passing was mourned not only here in Jamaica, but in the wider Caribbean, as she was a strong regionalist with working experience in libraries and information institutions in the Caribbean and Latin America.

We acknowledge her contribution to our profession and give thanks for her life and work.



#### Hermine Constantia Salmon, OD



The library career of Miss Hermine Salmon is so closely identified with the University of Technology, Jamaica, that one tends to forget that she once served in the Jamaica Library Service, before joining the then College of Arts, Science & Technology (CAST) in 1980. She led the development of what was a college library into a university library and became the first University Librarian of the University of Technology, Jamaica (UTech), retiring in 2009.

Hermine Salmon was also very active in the work of the Jamaica National information System, serving as the coordinator of the College Library Information Network (COLINET) from its inception in 1985 until her retirement from UTech in 2009. Under her leadership, COLINET became a vibrant and effective network, and it was during her tenure that the biennial COLINET Symposium was first held in 1999.

She was also very active in the then Jamaica Library Association (JLA), now known as the Library and Information Association of Jamaica (LIAJA). She served as President in 2000, the year the Association celebrated its 50th anniversary. She is no stranger to ACURIL, and actually served as co-chair of the 2008-2009 Local Organizing Committee when the ACURIL Conference was last held in Jamaica, 2009.



#### Mr. John Alexander Aarons, CD



An archivist as well as a librarian, Mr. Aarons has spent his entire working career in the information field. He has held the positions of Executive Director of the National Library of Jamaica, Government Archivist, Jamaica Archives and Records Department and finally as University Archivist at The University of the West Indies.

He has been active in the Library and Information Association of Jamaica – of which he is now an Honorary Member - serving in several positions including that of Treasurer and President. He is still serving, as he is the Secretary of the Retired Members Group.

Mr. Aarons has served as an adjunct member of staff of the Department of Library & Information Studies at The University of the West Indies, teaching Records and Archives Management. He was a member of the Committee which proposed, and then oversaw, the introduction of the post graduate degree programme in Archives Administration and taught some of the courses which he helped to design. Research and writing have been hallmarks of his career and he is the author of several publications. The ones which have given him the greatest satisfaction are the two volumes on Caribbean Archives which he co-edited with two colleagues.

For his sterling contribution to the fields of libraries and archives, the Government of Jamaica conferred on him the award of Commander of the Order of Distinction (CD).

We salute Mr. John Aarons for his outstanding contributions to the dual professions, being both a librarian and Archivist par excellence.



## Dr. Hazel Bennett, OD



Dr. Hazel Bennett is a true pioneer in the Jamaica library field. She began her career at the Jamaica Library Service only four years after it was established in 1948, rising to the position of Deputy Director. She joined the then Department of Library Studies when it was established in 1971, as one of the two West Indian lecturers and served there until her retirement. As a library educator, she influenced the lives of countless number of librarians throughout the region.

Active in the Library and Information Association of Jamaica (LIAJA) of which she is now an Honorary Member, she served in several capacities, including that of Secretary and as President on two separate occasions. One of the earliest librarians to obtain a doctorate in the field, her unpublished thesis, *A History of Libraries in Jamaica 1697 – 1987* is the most comprehensive study of Jamaican libraries.

Dr. Bennet is also a researcher and writer. She is the co-author of two significant and highly regarded publications - The *Story of the Jamaican People* with the late Sir Philip Sherlock, and the *Jamaican Theatre: Highlights of the Performing Arts in the Twentieth Century*, with her late husband, Wycliffe Bennett.

Dr Bennett has been the recipient of many national honours, including the Silver Musgrave Medal of the Institute of Jamaica and the Order of Distinction (OD), Officer Class, from the Government of Jamaica.

#### **Conference** Theme

The Association of Caribbean University, Research and Institutional Libraries (ACURIL) 52<sup>nd</sup> Conference being held from June 4-8, 2023 on the beautiful island of Jamaica, will focus on the theme *Innovation: Opportunities and Challenges In Libraries, Museums and Archives of the Caribbean*.

#### **Objectives of the Conference**

Through dynamic presentations, poster sessions, workshops and the exhibitors fair, the ACURIL LII 2023 Conference seeks to:

- Provide opportunities for the discussion and the development of new knowledge.
- Provide a space to reflect and share best practices.
- Open a discourse amongst Caribbean information professionals about the relevance of innovation in libraries and its future directions in enhancing service delivery.
- Foster collaboration with ACURIL's exhibitors and other stakeholders to develop new platforms to enhance library services.

The event will reflect four days of full engagement on the theme of innovative developments in the library and information field, and will culminate with an awards ceremony, which rewards and recognizes library and information professionals from across the Caribbean region.

Apart from the anticipated engaging presentations, discussions and displays, there will be ample opportunities to enjoy the food, culture and music in the island that gave reggae music to the world.

#### **Conference Sub-Themes**

The ACURIL LII 2023 Jamaica Conference Program presentations will explore the following four Subthemes:

#### 1. Developing Next Generation Library Facilities and Technologies

The world has seen sweeping changes that have forced libraries with a sense of urgency to search for a new generation of technology products and services to support user needs. This sub-theme will explore what Caribbean libraries have been doing to keep in step with developing next generation library facilities and technologies.



#### 2. Next Generation GLAM-R Services and Resources

Galleries, Libraries, Archives, Museums and Records Management (GLAM-R) institutions now simultaneously serve multiple generations of patrons, each bringing their own expectations and experiences. Even the composition of library collections have changed to include higher proportions of electronic and digital materials relative to print. How can regional institutions take their services to the next level? What resources do they need to do so? These questions and more will be closely examined under this sub-theme.

#### 3. The Knowledge Economy and Libraries, Museums and Archives

The knowledge economy is focused on the essential importance of human capital in the 21stcentury economy. The rapid expansion of knowledge and the increasing reliance on computerization, big data analytics, and automation are changing the economy of the developed world to one that is more dependent on intellectual capital and skills, and less dependent on the production process. What is the role of libraries, archives, museums and records management institutions in all of this change sweeping the world?

#### 4. Whole Person Preparation: Skills, Attitude, Training

Many libraries are suddenly finding themselves at tipping points that demand new operational priorities and strategies as well as staff competencies. What are the skills, attitude and training required by library staff to provide the innovation in service that is now the new imperative?



## **Conference Logo**



#### **Description of Logo**

The logo is inspired by the hummingbird. The doctor bird or swallow tail humming bird (Trochilus Polytmus), is one of the most outstanding of the 320 species of hummingbirds. It lives only in Jamaica. These birds' beautiful feathers have no counterpart in the entire bird population and they produce iridescent colours characteristic only of that family. In addition to these beautiful feathers, the mature male has two long tails which stream behind him when he flies. For years the doctor bird has been immortalized in Jamaican folklore and song. (...) The Arawaks spread the belief that the bird had magical powers. They called it the 'God bird', believing it was the reincarnation of dead souls.

The colors of the logo was inspired by the symbolism of the Jamaican Flag:

"The sun shineth, the land is green and the people are strong and creative" is the symbolism of the colours of the flag. Black depicts the strength and creativity of the people; Gold, the natural beauty of the sunlight and the wealth of the country; and Green signifies hope and agricultural resources.
